Q: Tell me a little about yourself?

"We are an organization made up of Juniors & Seniors in high school who have been determined as students who value character, leadership, honesty, and scholarship. We volunteer in our own community as well as communities around us through activities like providing landscaping for the elderly, supervising children, event assistance, and the project Pillars presents to us on a regular basis."

Q: Why did you start volunteering? What motivates you to continue volunteering?

Q: What is the best thing that has happened to you, or that you have seen while volunteering?

"When we demolished a house for Pillars, the progress that our group made in 6 hours was remarkable. We had all walls and ceilings on the first floor torn down, and all debris removed from the house and transferred to the dumpsters."
